## Our services

### Acute Nursing Care:

We offer a range of clinical nursing support including; neonatal discharges, children and young people with long-term conditions, oncology care, stoma care and those who have been prescribed intravenous antibiotics to be administered at home.

### Phlebotomy:

We take blood samples on behalf of GP's and consultants.

### Wound Care:

We assess, treat, dress and review wounds.

### Post Operative Care:

Nursing support and advice following surgery.

### Complex Nursing Care:

Nursing support and advice for children and young people who have long term conditions, life limiting conditions and/or complex health needs.

### Special School Service:

We have nurses supporting children and young people who attend special schools in Hull and East Riding. This care supports their access to education, by meeting their health needs during the school day.

### Who we are

We are a team of Children's Nurses, Adult and Learning Disability Nurses, Health and Development Practitioners and Health Care Support Workers.

### What we do

We offer a family friendly, needs-led service to children, young people, their families and carers.

We provide nursing assessment, treatment and intervention for children and young people aged 0-18 years in the community across the Hull and East Riding area.

We offer our service in clinics across the region, at home, school or other convenient venues as appropriate. We can also offer telephone advice, support and review.

### Continence Care:

Assessment, advice, support and treatment for enuresis (Hull only) and constipation. Continence product assessment and review for all for children and young people (East Riding) and children and young people attending Special Schools (Hull).

Nursing advice and support for children and young people with specialist continence needs, for example, catheterisation.

### Sleep Management:

Sleep support for children and young people with additional health needs who are already known to our service.

### End of Life Care:

24 hour on call nursing advice and support for children and young people who are nearing the end of their life.

### Continuing Care Assessment:

Nursing assessments are carried out to identify eligibility for continuing care funding, for children and young people with complex health needs.

### Transition Planning:

Support is provided for young people aged 14 years and over who have long term health needs, to facilitate the transition to adult health services.

### Training Parents and Carers:

Competency based, child specific training and support for parents and carers.
