Children's and Young Peoples Public Health Nursing Services

What you can expect

Our aim is to promote good health, prevent ill health and encourage healthy behaviour to enable children and young people reach their full potential.



The team are not based in schools and are available all year around. They work with young people in mainstream education, alternative school provision, home schooled and those not in education or training.

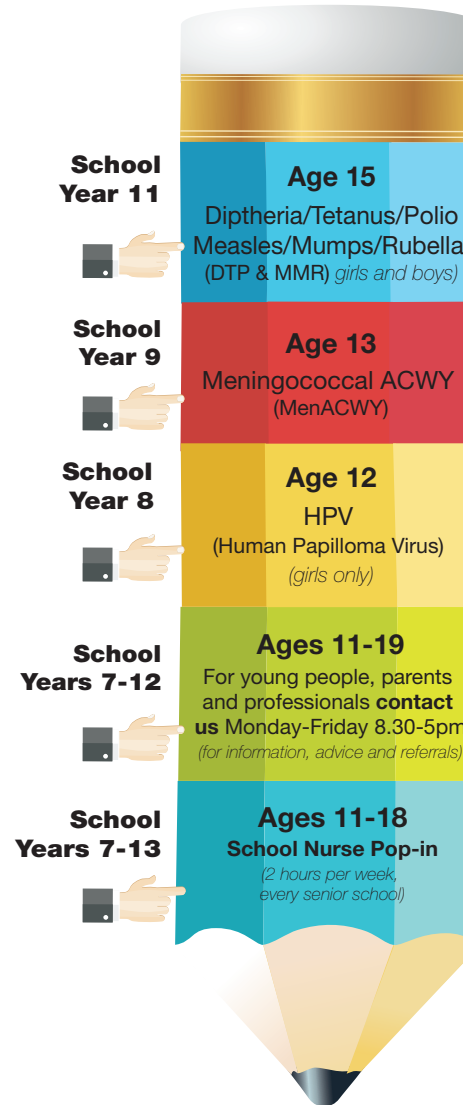
The 11-19 years School Health Team provides the following services:

- Health needs assessment
- Checking growth or hearing if required
- Assisting parents to obtain medical advice/assessments to help young people to make the best of their education
- Organising and delivering immunisations
- Working with young people who have special educational needs or learning disabilities, and referring to appropriate agencies in consultation with parents/carers as required
- Promoting good health to individual young people, parents and groups
- Liaison with specialist nurses for young people with individual medical needs e.g. Asthma, Epilepsy or Diabetes
- Support young people with bedwetting concerns and refer to the Specialist Nurse as necessary
- Confidential health pop-in for young people to discuss health concerns or worries
- Confidential sexual health services including pregnancy testing, Chlamydia screening, emergency contraception and condoms



Public Health Nursing Service: Your child aged 11-19 years

The 11-19 years School Health Team will work with young people to help make informed decisions about their health.



The 11-19 years School Health Team also work alongside other professionals including:

- Children's Social Workers
- Educational Psychologists
- Hospital Staff
- General Practitioners (GP's)
- Teachers and School Support Staff
- Educational Welfare Officers
- Speech and Language Therapists
- Occupational Therapists
- Physiotherapists
- Dental Health Services
- The Fire Service
- Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services
- Local Police and Community Support Officers
- Local Safeguarding Children's Board/ Teams
- Youth Justice Team

Transition to secondary school may be a challenging time for a young person. If you need advice or support please contact your School Health Team.

Every young person should be encouraged to attend school and attain their full potential. If they are unwell please let the school know and follow the correct procedure to ensure their absence is authorised.

Young people in secondary school will be offered immunisations as part of the national immunisation programme. If you are unsure about your child's immunisation status please contact your GP.

Your child should have regular dental checks.
